Local roadworks underway

In the latest Waka Kotahi (NZ Transport Agency) newsletter a number of local projects are listed for action. These include repairs to the Pumpkin Hill slip, the completion of the repairs to Hikuai Bridge, and the (biggie!) Pepe Bridge replacement.

Work is already underway on the repair to the large under-slip on SH25 near Sailors Grave Road. Waka Kotahi reports that this project is one of the more complex repairs in their Coromandel Recovery Programme and is likely to take 6 months to complete. Brought down during the severe weather in early 2023, the slip is about 30m wide

and 20m deep. Contractors will remove about 2100 cubic metres of material and then build a retaining wall. Teams will be working at the top and bottom of the slip. The road will be widened to give more space for these works to be done, but stop/go traffic management will be used as required during construction.

Down the road, contractors will be back at work on the Hikuai Bridge this week to complete repairs, started earlier this year but unable to be completed due to poor weather. This work will involve short closures as required and remains weather-dependent.

Meanwhile, we are getting

excited about the progress towards a new two-lane Pepe Bridge! The case for a new two-lane bridge across Pepe Stream, with a path for pedestrians, and improvements to the Pepe Road intersection was approved by Waka Kotahi in 2022 and funding for its construction has been allocated. The project is now in the "pre-implementation phase". The scope of

works, design and consent applications will be finalised. Although the construction timeline has not been set, a key focus is the minimisation of impact and duration. This augurs well for significant progress to be made once the go button is pushed!

These local roadworks are great news for our part of the Coromandel with things finally being reinstated.

Taiwan Cherry tree invasion

Everyone loves flowering plants. They bring the bees and diverse bird life but some flowering trees come with big problems! Taiwan Cherry (Prunus campanulata) is an invasive weed. The tree is a real threat to our Tairua environment. It is spread easily by birds. The seeds (from the flowers) are longlived and widely dispersed and it loves our Tairua climate. The Taiwan Cherry is a deciduous tree that grows up to 10m in height. You see it from late July through to early September, when the mature trees produce thousands of deep pink flowers that attract pollinators such as bees and tūī. Its thin leaves are 5-17cm long and serrated. It grows in clumps that prevent regeneration of native species that provide all-year-round food and habitat for our native animals.

Native birds such as tūī

feed on the berries and nectar, however, the nectar only lasts for a couple of weeks. Our natives like pōhutukawa, flax, ti kouka (cabbage trees), kōwhai and ngaio are better for the birds.

We appreciate that Taiwan Cherry trees are attractive garden trees and that they draw in birds and bees, but these benefits are far outweighed by the disastrous ecological impacts these trees cause. Some district councils, like Nelson and Northland have made it illegal to sell, propagate or distribute this tree. TCDC is also looking to add this tree to its pest management register.

So what can we do here in Tairua? If you have a tree, cut it down and then poison the stump as it will regrow! There will be seedlings all around Tairua – pull them out, roots and all. Pestfree Tairua will also be removing the Taiwan Cherry when they are doing their trap lines. Let us make Tairua Taiwan Cherry-free too!

Tairua River Trail moves forward

Our Council has approved signing an agreement with the trail builder, Hikuai District Trust, that will guarantee ongoing public access to the trail once it's complete.

The agreement will also mean that our Council can ensure the trail is safe and maintained, while the Trust is responsible for, and pays for, maintaining the trail, including assets like boardwalks and the bridge over the Tairua River that was recently consented.

The Trust has been working for years on building the path (and fundraising to pay the costs) to connect Pāuanui and Tairua.

A 120-metre suspension bridge will cross the Tairua River from where the trail currently ends on the Pāuanui side of the river, and the final stage of the trail into Tairua can now be built, to complete a fully off-road cycling and walking path between the two towns.



The risk of the Trust falling over leaving Council with the costs of maintaining the trail assets are seen as minimal as the Trust is well established and well run and has considerable fundraising experience.

Our Tairua-Pāuanui Community Board has contributed \$592,900 in funding since 2013 and has committed to providing an additional \$171,400 in grants by 2027. The Trust has raised an additional \$515,300 and has benefited from thousands of hours of volunteer labour.



A word from our Board Chair, Warwick Brooks -

"With Council's support, the construction of stage four of the Tairua River Trail is now imminent, which is exciting news for both our ward and the wider district. Many of you are eager to experience the trek between Tairua and Pāuanui via the new, purpose-built bridge. Our Community Board has strongly supported the trail's construction and maintenance so far, and I'm confident this will continue. This is a great win for both locals and visitors alike."


